<p>Example #1 - Application to Pay in Installments - No fees due from prior case(s) - 1st installment remitted with Application - The full fee must now be remitted no later than 60days after filing. A minimum initial installment and no more than two additional installments will be standard. This applies to all examples on this chart.</p>	<p>Order entered granting Application; Order sets out payment schedule, <u>using the same schedule for 7's already in place for 13's and individual 11's.</u> Chapter 12's are also included in these procedures. Administering chapter 7's as we do other cases is the main recommendation for streamlining procedures.</p>	<p>If debtor defaults on either subsequent installment payment, a deficiency notice is issued setting a 7 day deadline. Cases will be dismissed without further notice or hearing in the event of a default This practice is already in place.</p>
<p>Example #2 - Application to Pay in Installments - No fees due from prior case(s) - No funds or only a portion of the minimum initial payment of \$75 remitted with the Application.</p>	<p>Order entered granting Application; Order sets 7 day deadline for the initial payment and then mirrors #1 referenced above.</p>	<p>If debtor defaults on either subsequent installment payment, a deficiency notice is issued setting a 7 day deadline. Cases will be dismissed without further notice or hearing in the event of a default This practice is already in place.</p>
<p>Example #3 - Application to Pay in Installments - Fee due (all or a portion) from a previous case - No funds or only a partial payment remitted with the Application</p>	<p>Go to Step #2</p>	<p>Order Denying Application is entered; 7 day deadline for the fee due in the current case in full. Automatic dismissal if payment not remitted. <i>ab initio</i> language in current version of this Order to be removed.</p>

<p>The next two examples deal with situations for which we currently have no standard procedures in place. Three possible options but only those that apply to the specific case will appear on the Order</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) pay the fee in full 2) file an Application to pay in installments along with \$75 3) file an IFP Application if appropriate <p>Automatic dismissal to follow if debtor fails to comply.</p>
<p>Example #5</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - No Application to Pay in Installments - Fee due (all or a portion) from a previous case - No funds or only a partial payment remitted with the Application 	<p>Go to Step #2</p>	<p>New Order Regarding Unpaid Filing Fees is entered that includes a 7 day deadline. Two possible options, depending the specifics of the case may appear:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) pay the fee in full 2) file an IFP Application if appropriate <p>Automatic dismissal to follow if debtor fails to comply.</p>
