

IMPORTANT NOTICE

New CM/ECF Event Codes Available related to Bankruptcy Rule 3002.1

The adoption of Rule 3002.1 on December 1, 2011 placed new requirements on mortgage creditors, trustees and debtors. The USBC in the Northern District of Georgia, along with many other courts across the country, upgraded to version 4.2 of CM/ECF at that time in part to accommodate the requirements of this new bankruptcy rule.

Six new docket events relating to Rule 3002.1 are a part of version 4.2:

Three supplemental claims events that **do not** appear on the docket but are instead linked to a filed claim:

- Notice of Mortgage Payment Change
- Notice of Post Petition Fees, Expenses, and Charges
- Response to Notice of Final Cure Payment

Three new events that appear on the docket:

- Motion to Determine Mortgage Fees and Expenses
- Notice of Final Cure Mortgage Payment
- Motion to Determine Final Cure and Mortgage Payment

In response to challenges expressed by filers to the difficulty in complying with the requirements of Rule 3002.1 in situations where a claim to which the supplements should be linked is not filed, the Administrative Office of the U.S. Courts has released three new docket events which have been implemented by the Georgia Northern Bankruptcy Court. **Please see the [instructions](#) for these new docket events and remember that one should never use the “docket” option if it is possible to link to the appropriate mortgage claim.**

The implementation of these new event codes allows us to address the difficulties expressed by CM/ECF filers while preserving the intent of Rule 3002.1.
