ORDER

On August 4, 2009, Nadine Jackson-Rone (hereinafter the "Debtor") filed a voluntary petition under Chapter 13 of the Bankruptcy Code (case number 09-12739-WHD). On October 5, 2009, this Court dismissed the case pursuant to section 109(g) of the Bankruptcy Code, which rendered her ineligible to be a debtor in another Chapter 13 case for a period of 180 days from the date of the entry of the Order. Among the grounds for doing so were the Chapter 13 Trustee's allegations that the Debtor failed to pay any funds into her case, failed to appear at the first meeting of creditors, and failed to file a plan and schedules required by the Code. Further, the Debtor had filed two previous Chapter 13 cases, Case

Numbers 08-13608-WHD and 09-11621-WHD, which were dismissed for failure to obtain confirmation in February 2009 and July 2009.

On January 4, 2010, the Debtor filed a voluntary petition under Chapter 13 (Case Number 10-10024-WHD). Pursuant to this Court's October 5, 2009 Order, the Debtor was ineligible for relief under the Bankruptcy Code at the time she filed the instant case.

Accordingly, Case Number 10-10024-WHD is *void abinitio* and is hereby **DISMISSED**. Further, as it appears that the Debtor has abused the bankruptcy system by filing serial cases with no intention of prosecuting the cases, the Court finds sufficient basis to bar the Debtor, Nadine Jackson-Rone, a/k/a Nadinemarie Rone, Nadine M. Rone, Nadine Marie Rone, and Nadine Marie Jackson-Rone, from filing a petition under Chapter 13 of the Bankruptcy Code in the Northern District of Georgia for a period of two (2) years from the date of the entry of this Order.

The Debtor is advised that, should she file a petition under Chapter 13 of the Code in the Northern District of Georgia during the two-year period, such petition will also be *void abinitio* and the act of filing the petition shall constitute contempt of this Court's Order. Such contempt may be subject to sanctions.

The Clerk is **DIRECTED** to serve a copy of this Order on the Debtor, the United States Trustee, the Chapter 13 Trustee, and all creditors.
