IN RE: AMENDMENT TO ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2020-01

ORDER

Administrative Order 2020-01 entered by this Court on March 11, 2020, restricted access to all Northern District of Georgia Courthouses to exclude various categories of persons described in the Order, including those who had traveled to four specified countries within 14 days of their appearance at the Courthouse. Restrictions imposed by Order 2020-01 were intended to insulate those in Northern District Courthouses from exposure to the coronavirus and its related disease, COVID-19.

Since entry of the Court's Order, the number of countries with widespread coronavirus outbreaks has significantly increased. The United States Department of State has now issued a Global Level 4, Do Not Travel, Health Advisory advising United States citizens to avoid international travel due to the global impact of COVID-19. Continued protection of Courthouse populations and operations require that the country restrictions of Administrative Order 2020-01 be expanded to include travel to any foreign country.

ORDERED, effective immediately, Administrative Order 2020-01, Northern District of Georgia, is amended as follows:

- Persons who have been in any foreign country or participated in international travel within the last 14 days:

These restrictions are temporary and will remain in place until it is determined to be safe to remove them. People who think they may have been exposed to the coronavirus should contact their healthcare provider immediately.
